Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP)
Criteria for Qualifying Organizations

The Montana Justice Foundation (MJF) is a non-profit organization which supports programs that promote access to justice in Montana. The MJF Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP) is a statewide program for law school graduates employed in non-profit organizations dedicated to serving the legal needs of low-income individuals and families in Montana. The program was designed to assist in the recruitment and retention of qualified staff attorneys to serve Montana's legal aid sector.

Applicants to the program must be employed on a full-time basis with an approved non-profit organization. The following organizations have been approved by the MJF:
